New Hampshire Scholars Outreach Programs

**Presentations for students and parents available
to all participating New Hampshire Scholar Districts**

New Hampshire Scholars staff is available to assist in coordinating, scheduling and presenting (if needed) any or all of these outreach programs. We encourage both middle and high schools to offer ongoing reinforcement activities such as these to ensure that students are aware of the program's advantages and are motivated to challenge themselves. By providing incentives such as special programs, business partner activities and classroom presentations, students will better understand that taking rigorous courses will better prepare them for college and career.

Kick Off Event (New Hampshire Scholars 101)

Grades 8 & 9 (parents optional)

This PowerPoint presentation introduces students to the program. It describes the value of taking a rigorous core course of study as it relates learning high level skills to future workforce opportunities. The message of furthering your education and making the most of your high school years is predominant. Students are encouraged to develop a 4-year education plan and sign the New Hampshire Scholars' pledge.

When? Fall for 9th graders; winter prior to course selection for 8th graders

It's Never Too Late to Begin

Grades 10-12 (parents optional)

Many students may have never heard the message about taking rigorous courses (or maybe they have not taken the advice to do so). This PowerPoint presentation engages students to create a personal education plan and finish strong in high school. Colleges and employers look for students who challenge themselves and attain high level skills. Even high school seniors have one last chance to make the most of their high school experience. This is a perfect presentation for upperclassmen in need of motivation.

When? Anytime (no later than fall for seniors)

New Hampshire Scholars Game

Grades 8-12

Looking for a fun activity to engage active New Hampshire Scholars? This game is played in PowerPoint format and provides students a chance to learn and compete on topics such as college planning, career exploration, financial aid, academic rigor and New Hampshire Scholar program details. It can be played by as many as 4-5 teams of 10 students each. Schools may look to a business partner to sponsor giveaways, prizes or lunch.

When? Anytime

State Scholars Overview & Introduction
